TRY THIS:

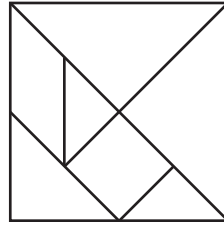
Make your own TANGRAM SET inspired by artist Nichole Gronvold-Roller.

Supplies

- Light cardboard like a cereal box or the cardboard backing to a used-up sketch pad
- Ruler, scissors, and pencil
- Crayons, markers, or colored pencils
- Tangram template (included in this PDF)

Step 1

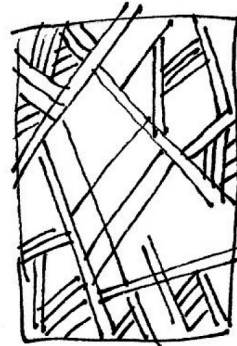
Print out the included tangram template and cut out all of the triangle shapes.

Step 2

Decorate your cardboard with crisscrossing lines (use the ruler to draw nice straight ones!) leaving some bigger areas open and filling in smaller areas with lots of crazy lines. Color in your crazy geometric patterns and shapes with bright, bold colors.

Step 3

Trace the triangle shapes onto your cardboard and cut them all out. Now you have a sturdy tangram set.

Step 4

Use your geometric patterned Tangram set to create an unlimited number of crazy polygon-shaped artworks like Nichole Gronvold-Roller!
